Section 1: Description of Indicator, Implementation and Scoring

Method to be Used	Expert-Based Assessment	
Introduction	Indicator 7C measures access to, engagement in, and the composition of existing multi-stakeholder platforms.	
Source of Methodology	Dashboard, ActionAid VGGT Toolkit	
Data Needed	The information necessary for this indicator can be found in the public documents regarding the existence of and public participation in national-level multistakeholder platforms, especially those formed specifically to address concerns of land governance.	
How to Implement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Questions in indicator 7C should be answered by a chosen representative of the stakeholder group that is implementing the indicator. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ No specific requirements apply, though knowledge of the existence of and engagement in multi-stakeholder platforms at a national level will be fundamental. • Indicator 7C has only one section, which we refer to as a “block.” • In Section 2 you will find two blocks (Block 1 and Block 2) that include a number of questions to be answered. • Block 1 has a single question, which will be answered “Yes or “No.” • Block 2 has a series of questions that should be answered on a scale from 0 to 3, according to the scoring rubric outlined below. • The scores for each of these respective blocks will be calculated directly below the blocks, and will generate two numbers: the “Block 1 Score” or B1 and the “Block 2 Score” or B2. • These numbers will be used in Section 3 to obtain the final score for Indicator 7C. 	
How to Score	Block 1:	<p>For the only question in this block will be answered “Yes” or “No.”</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A “Yes” response will receive 15 points. • A “No” response will receive zero points. <p>If the question is answered “Yes,” a brief justification or reference should be included in the space below the response. If the question in Block 1 in answered “No,” you will automatically receive a score of “0” for Block 2.</p> <p>The Block 1 Score (B1) will be calculated below Block 1, according to the following equation. The score B1 will either be 0 or 100.</p> $\left(\frac{B1.a}{15}\right) \times 100 = B1$
	Block 2:	<p>For each question, assign the corresponding score (0-3) from the rubric provided. Provide justifications and references and, at the end of Block 2, sum the scores from these three questions to derive B2.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Again, it’s important to note that <u>if you answered “No” to the question in Block 1, there is no need to answer the questions in Block 2. It will be an automatic 0.</u> <p>The Block 2 Score (B2) will be calculated below Block 2, according to the following equation.</p> $\left(\frac{B2.a}{15}\right) \times 100 = B2$
	Final Score	Enter B1 and B2 in the equation provided in Section 3 and multiply the result by 100 to derive the Final Score for Indicator 7C (0-100).
