How to Implement	 All of the questions in Indicator 10B are best suited for a human rights practitioner, ideally someone who is working directly in the protection or prevention of crimes against land and environment and other human rights defenders. Indicator 10B is divided into three sections, which we refer to as "blocks." Each block can be considered a "sub-indicator," as it will address a different aspect of the overall indicator. The following blocks are part of this indicator: Block 1: Preventative Measures Block 2: Individual or Collective Protection Block 3: Effectiveness of Existing Measures For each block, answer questions that will result in a "Block Score." The Block Scores for each block (B1, B2, B3) will be used to calculate your Final Score for Indicator 10B.

	Block 2: Individual or Collective Protection	 All of the questions in Block 2 will be answered "Yes" or "No." For each question that is answered, "Yes," provide a reference and briefly justify your response in the space provided below the question. Every question answered "Yes" will receive three points. Every question answered "No" will receive zero points. At the end of the block, you will sum the scores of all the questions. This total will become the "Block 2 Score" or B2, which will be used for the final calculation. 		
	Block 3: Effectiveness of Existing Measures	 In Block 3, all questions will be answered using a scale of 0-3, where zero is the highest score and three is the highest. Use the <u>Indicator 10B Rubric</u> as a guide for scoring all the questions. It is located just below Block 3. For all positive responses (above 0), provide a reference and briefly justify your response in the space provided below the question. At the end of the block, you will sum the scores of all the questions. This total will become the "Block 3 Score" or B3, which will be used for the final calculation.
