Commitment 1: Secure Tenure Rights

1C	Women and men who perceive their rights to land are protected against dispossession or eviction, disaggregated by type of tenure
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Section 1: Description of Indicator, Implementation and Scoring

Method to be Used	National or Sub-National Representative Survey
Introduction	Indicator 1C captures perception of tenure security among men and women, for different types of tenure
Source of Methodology	PRIndex
Data Needed	PRIndex will collect raw data from a nationally representative survey implemented in Senegal in 2018. Specific questions from this survey will be used to calculate Indicator 1C.

How to Implement	Implementation of 1C will depend upon the data collected in the PRIndex survey. Below you will see the relevant questions for Indicator 1C, according to sections of the PRIndex survey. The data from these questions will be aggregated at national level and shared with the in-country Dashboard lead for scoring.
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How to Derive Dashboard 1C from PRIndex Survey	Overview	Below you will see the PRIndex questions, by section, that will derive Dashboard Indicator 1C. We still have to confirm how this data will arrive and thus, how they will be scored.
	Section 0: Interview Data and Introduction	<p>Q6 – [Area: government classification] – narrows data set to only rural respondents.</p> <p>R1. Urban</p> <p>R2. Rural – select for R2.</p>
	Section 1: Screening	<p>Q21 – [Random selection] – automatically chooses the person who will respond to the survey.</p> <p>R1. Name, Age, Gender – include data on gender.</p>
	Section 2: Respondent Profile	None
	Section 3: Tenure Assessment of Dwelling	<p>Q37 – [Ownership] – tells us if land is owned privately, jointly, or by community. Could include indigenous lands if specified in R12. Other.</p> <p><i>Who owns this property?</i></p> <p>R1. I own myself [alone] – select for private ownership.</p> <p>R2. I own jointly with my spouse – select for private ownership.</p> <p>R3. I own jointly with someone else – select for private ownership.</p> <p>R4. A family member who lives in this household owns</p> <p>R5. A family member not living in this household owns</p> <p>R6. Another private person/individual owns [not related to persons in this household/not a family member]</p> <p>R7. Employer owns</p> <p>R8. A company [not employer] owns</p> <p>R9. A public institution owns/government owns</p> <p>R10. A cooperative owns</p> <p>R11. Community owns – select for community land.</p> <p>R12. Other, please specify _____ – select and include if indigenous land.</p>
	Section 4: Tenure Security Perceptions	<p>Q45 – [Worry of leaving against will] – tells us the perception of tenure security among those with documentation or secure tenure rights living in rural areas.</p> <p><i>How worried are you that you could lose the right to use this property, or part of this property against your will in the next five years?</i></p> <p>R1. Not worried at all</p> <p>R2. Not worried</p> <p>R3. Somewhat worried</p> <p>R4. Very worried</p> <p>R5. (Don't know)</p> <p>R6. (Refused)</p>
